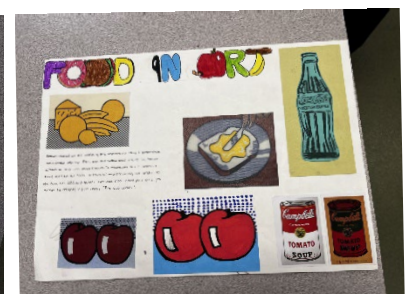
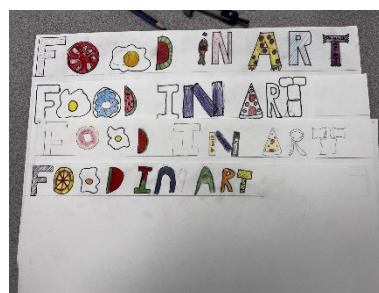
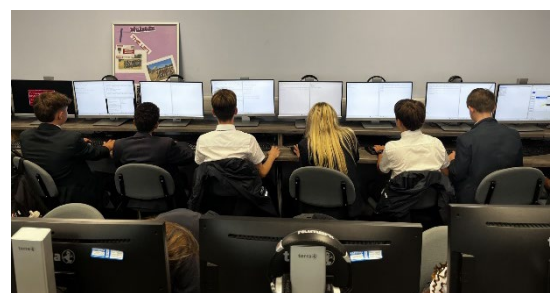
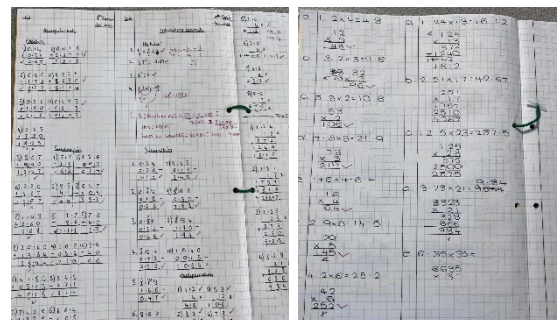
Year 9

Arbor Parent Portal

At the start of this school year, please take the opportunity to check the data we have recorded for yourselves and your child. It is important that we have the most up-to-date information for our families to support us in safeguarding your children and communicating with you appropriately.



If any personal details have changed, such as home addresses, contact telephone numbers, emergency contacts, or your child's mode of transport to school, these can be updated via your login to the Arbor Parent Portal or Arbor App.

Please note: Any changes that you make via your Arbor parent login do not appear instantly; they will be reviewed online by one of our school administrators and then confirmed. This may take 24 to 48 hours.

Free School Meals



Thank you to all those families who received Free School Meals support during the 2025/26 school year and have already submitted a formal recheck of your current household circumstances to check your entitlement for the 2026/27 academic year.

If this has NOT been done already, and your child has previously claimed Free School Meals at Hagley, please ensure that this is completed for all students in your family. This can be done quickly and securely through the Worcestershire County Council [Portal Home](#). All you need is your Date of Birth and National Insurance number.

We will be following up with families where this information remains incomplete to offer support and expedite the process. All student eligibility **MUST** be finalised by **17th September 2026**.

If your circumstances have changed, and you believe that you are no longer eligible please advise the school via enquiry_hchs@emmausmac.com

Every child whose family receives Universal Credit is now legally entitled to free school meals, regardless of your household income. If you receive Universal Credit, please consider making an application for your child. Registering could save your family around £500 per child per year (if a child were to access the school canteen and have a meal each lunchtime, this is the potential saving that could be made).

Update from Student Services and First Aid

Following updated guidance in relation to **Benedict's Law**, we are reviewing and updating our records for all students with allergies.



If your child has **any new allergies** or changes to an existing allergy, please complete a **Food Safety Management Form** (included with this letter) and provide any relevant supporting information, including **Allergy Action Plans**, where applicable. It is essential that the school holds accurate and up-to-date medical information to ensure we can support your child safely and effectively.

In addition, **Flu Vaccinations** will take place in school on **16/11/2026**. Please look out for an email from **Vaccination UK** regarding consent for this vaccination. It is important that you complete the form and respond, whether you are giving **consent or non-consent**.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping us maintain accurate medical records and support the health and wellbeing of all students.
