On Tuesday, the whole school in different areas showed their respect to the many soldiers that fought in the war, by having two minutes of silence and listening to The Last Post. We do this every year on the 11th of November, Remembrance Day. Many of us also wear poppies during this time period, these are usually bought from charities that support ex-soldiers and also the soldiers fighting for us now. The pupils were respectful during this time, as we are also taught, earlier on, the importance of remembrance day and how big of an impact the War had on many, including some students who lost family members to the war.

Year 7 Update from Mrs Imrie

Year 7 have returned from their half term break fully refreshed and ready to be POWERful learners. In the last newsletter they had achieved collectively almost 19,000 house points, this is now a massive 22,138 by Thursday lunchtime. Alongside this is that more than twenty-six students have individually gained more than 150 and three students have smashed the 200 barrier. What an achievement!

It is also important to note that the number of behaviour points within the year group remain low and, with over 98 achieving zero! I was also delighted to tell Year 7 this morning that not 1 student had a detention today. Again, another achievement that testifies to how wonderfully Year 7 have settled in and have responded to our call to be a Hagley POWERful learner.

Since we returned in Character, Culture and Formation lessons we have looked at the importance of friendships, living in a diverse society and on Monday this week Year 7 amazed us with their odd socks for Anti-Bullying week.

There has been much excitement in form also this week with the much anticipated first inter-house competition next week, with 5-a-side football being the first competition. We look forward to this taking place next Tuesday after school in the Sports Hall.

The Voice have been playing an active role in reviewing areas of school life during their meetings. As part of planning for next year and looking at the impact of the Embedding Formative Assessment the Voice have been working with Mrs Smith to review the process to date. During the meeting students were asked to review, and feedback on different techniques teachers have been using in their daily teaching practice. The feedback was collated and presented to the staff during their focus groups.
