
Dear Parent(s), carer(s) and students,

I do hope that all your families and friends are well and please trust that you are always in our prayers at school.

Next month is one of two months devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary. October, along with May, is dedicated to the Mary as it is the month of the Holy Rosary. We will set aside time to pray the rosary together in the coming month.

One of our new set prayers is the Salve Regina, the Hail Holy Queen, and throughout October all students and staff will pray this prayer routinely. Please do find time to pray it too.

It is a famous Marian hymn and antiphon that praises the Virgin Mary as the "mother of mercy" and asks for her intercession. It is one of the four Marian antiphons and is sung during specific seasons and at the conclusion of the Rosary. It is a plea to Mary, acknowledging human suffering in this life and asking her to turn her merciful eyes toward us and show us the blessed fruit of her womb, Jesus.



## This Week in Worship Year 11 Mass

Mass today was an important time to come together to pause and reflect on how we can be better as a community. We listened to Fr Philip's homily on how the Cross is truly significant to our faith and how Jesus's suffering can relate to us today. #### **House Points**

As a staff body we are making a real effort to award lots more House Points than in previous years. We want to routinely recognise those students that continually live out our values, rise to the challenge of their education and always give their personal best. Please do keep an eye out on Arbor for your child's House Points record.

#### **Attendance Matters**

Because of Open Morning next week is only a 4-day week for the children as school is closed on Friday, but a shortened week is no less important and as always it is vitally important that you send your child to school every day. With that in mind I am concerned about some of the early absence that has already arisen in the first 17/18 days of this term.

Exemplary attendance is **not**, and never will be, about the school chasing statistics but recognising that absence increases disadvantaged in so many ways. This includes missing learning that if not learnt, can't be recalled when assessments and public exams take place, therefore putting children behind their peers. Creating isolation from their friends and year group by missing the important social facets of school life that builds unity, community and belonging. And weakening resilience and, ironically, heightening anxiety when time is taken off because of stress or worry, something we can support you and your child with.

To that end, please remember that a cough, cold or sore throat is not sufficient to be absent from school. If your child has been sick, they can still attend the next day, only repeated vomiting and/or diarrhoea requires 48-hour absence. While Covid-19 is still around it does not necessitate absence unless accompanied by a high temperature.

I must also ask that medical appointments are only arranged in the mornings so that your child can still be in school by 9.20am or if in



the afternoon are after 2pm. Medical appointments between these times will be unauthorised unless a child leaves school after registration in the morning and returns before 1.20pm.

#### Restart a heart live



Next week, on Wednesday 1st October, students will take part in 'Restart a heart live'. This live stream event broadcast on YouTube is delivered by paramedics and will allow our students to take part in a short interactive session on CPR during their lesson time. Its mission is to train as many people as possible in lifesaving CPR, an essential skill that can double the chance of survival for someone experiencing an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest.

#### **World Mental Health Day**

On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> October 2025 we will be marking World Mental Health Day. This international day is dedicated to raising awareness about mental health issues, reducing stigma, and promoting efforts to support mental well-being. Students will take part in a range of in school activities on this day and we will also be fundraising for the Young Minds charity.


