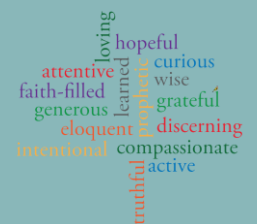

The hub is our safe refuge where additional support is available for students

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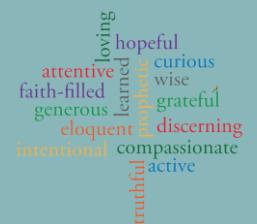
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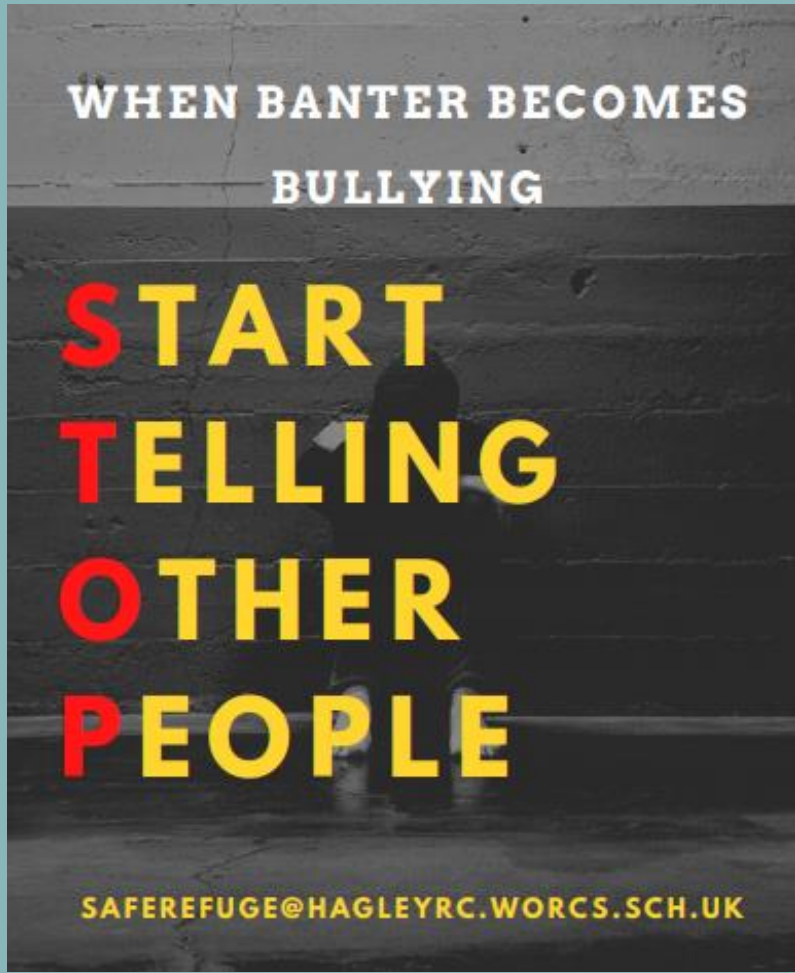

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Uniform

- Navy blue blazer with school badge
- Skirt – checked stitched down pleat skirt or mid grey, tailored full-length trousers
- Navy blue tie with house stripe:
 - Anselm – Blue
 - Bede – Green
 - Chad – Red
 - Gregory – Grey
 - Kenelm – Yellow
 - Wulstan – Purple
- School jumper is optional



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Uniform

- PE kit:
 - Navy blue tailored polo top with amber panels
 - Plain navy blue shorts or skirt
 - Sports trainers
 - Navy blue/White sports socks
 - Optional items:
 - Navy blue sweatshirt
 - Plain navy blue base layer
 - Plain navy blue sports leggings



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Uniform

- Coats should be a plain dark colour – preferably navy or black with no colour deviations.
- Hats, scarves and gloves should be navy/black.
- Hoodies are not permitted to be worn in school.
- Black shoes – trainers are not permitted. No sports brands/logos.
- No extreme haircuts or hair colouring
- Piercings – one small plain stud may be worn in each ear. No other piercings are permitted.
- Jewellery – the only permitted jewellery is a watch.
- Make up should be discreet.
- False eyelashes, varnished/acrylic/gel/shellac nails are not allowed



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Equipment

- School bag – holdall, rucksack or large shoulder bag
- School planner
- Pencil case
- A full selection of pens – black, blue and red
- Pencils
- Ruler (ideally 30cm)
- An eraser
- Sharpener
- Highlighters are useful too in secondary school



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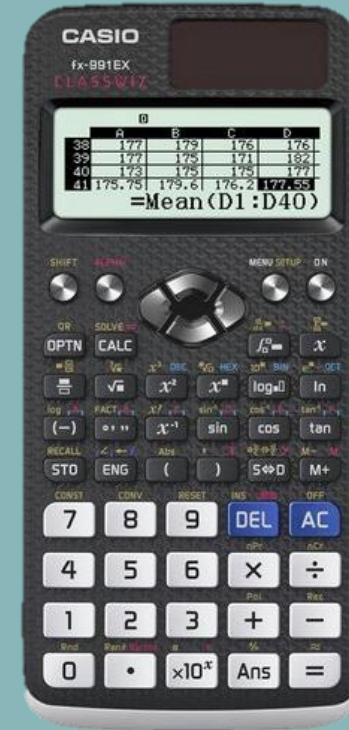
